

TRAVEL GRANTS

General condition:

LIMNA offers a limited number of travel grants to support PhD students and postdocs for their travel expenses to attend congresses, conferences or workshops in relation with LIMNA thematic (metabolism, nutrition, aging).

Travel grants will only be allocated to students/postdocs within LIMNA network who will actively participate to the conference or workshop either via a poster or an oral presentation.

- Applicants cannot be awarded more than one travel grant during a period of 12 months.
- Candidates that accept a travel grant from other organisation, are not eligible for LIMNA funding. LIMNA should be informed if the applicant has submitted or is going to submit an application to other organizations.
- The applicant can apply for the travel grant before knowing if his/her abstract is selected, but will inform LIMNA about the results of the selection outcome. Grants will not be allocated to non-selected abstracts.
- The applicant should include LIMNA logo into their poster/acknowledgement slide.

Funding:

- European conferences or workshops: 1000 CHF
- Oversea or intercontinental conferences: 2000 CHF.

The fund can be used for registration, travel expenses and accommodation.

A certificate of attendance will be requested as well as a justification of how the money was used.

Application:

There are tow deadlines for application:

November 30th for the events of the first semester: January 1st - June 30th (answer in December)

May 31^{st} for the events of the second semester: July 1^{st} – December 31^{st} (answer in June)









The Application should be done online via the LIMNA web Site.

The online application form includes:

- Your name and the name of your laboratory/institution where you are doing your PhD or post-doc.
- Abstract submitted to the congress/workshop.
- The name of the event, dates and location.
- In few lines you should explain your motivation to attend the conference or workshop.

Candidature selection:

LIMNA direction committee will be in charge of candidate selection.

The applicants should fulfill the requirements indicated in the general conditions.

- 1. Students that already received a grant will not have priority.
- 2. To rank the candidates, a 1,2 scale method will be used. 1 being the highest and 2 the lowest. For each candidate, the direction committee members will rank the selection criteria between 1 and 2. The final sum will allow the ranking of the candidates (the lowest the sum, the best).
- 3. Ranking criteria.
 - a. Conference/workshop quality
 - b. Scientific evaluation of the submitted abstract (project, methods etc..)
 - c. Evaluation of the motivation to attend the meeting.
- 4. A balance between the different laboratories and the different institutions will be respected.
- 5. In case of divergent results, a second selection step (with the same process) will be done between the best candidates.

Grant allocation will be communicated:

In December and in June.
